
Teaching and learning aims

At the end of the lesson pupils will be able to:

Activities


Step 1: 1. Introduction to Drawing Techniques (15 minutes):

- Teacher's Explanation:
 - "Today, we will explore exciting drawing techniques. Let's discover new ways to expressourselves visually!"
- Activity: Drawing Creative Shapes and Lines
 - Students practice strokes and creative lines to become familiar with the possibilities of drawing.

Detailed Techniques:

Lines and Contours: Teach students how to use differenttypes of lines to express shapes.

Step 2: 2. Drawing with Textures (15 minutes):

- Teacher's Explanation:
 - "Now, let's add textures to our drawing. Let'smake it come alive with different tactile sensations!"
- Activity: Creating Visual Textures
 - Students experiment with shading techniques and patterns to add textures to their drawings.

Detailed Techniques:

- Shading: Instructions on how to apply shadows to createthree-dimensional effects.
- Patterns: Exploration of simple patterns to add visualinterest.

Step 3: Collaborative Team Drawing (20-25 minutes):

- Teacher's Explanation:
 - "It's time to collaborate! Let's work together to create a unique drawing mural." But first...let's watch the video about different cultural styles youcan use!
- Activity: Collaborative Mural
 - Students divide into teams to contribute to acollective mural using different drawing techniques.
- Detailed Techniques:
 - Collaboration: Instructions on how to combine styles andtechniques harmoniously.

Step 4: Gallery and Final Talk (5 minutes):

- Teacher's Explanation:
 - "Let's showcase our creations! Share our experiences and artistic discoveries."
- Activity: Exhibition and Final Talk
 - Students exhibit their drawings and participate ina final talk about their learnings and experiences.

- Peer Evaluation (Team Drawing):

- Activity: Peer assessment within teams focusing on collaboration, communication, and individual contributions.
- Purpose: Promotes accountability within the teamand fosters communication skills.

4. Continuous Engagement:

Class Participation:

- *Criteria:* Active participation in discussions, enthusiasm, and constructive engagement during the entire sequence.
- Recognition: Ongoing acknowledgment of students' contributions to a positive and collaborative learning environment.

5. Additional Considerations:

- Creativity Journal:

- Activity: Keeping a creativity journal where students document their drawing journey, challenges faced, and new techniques learned.
- Purpose: Encourages reflective practice and provides additional insights into individual growth.

Culminating Discussion:

 Activity: A concluding discussion where studentsshare their experiences, discuss challenges overcome, and express what they enjoyed most.
