# **Teaching and learning aims**

At the end of the lesson pupils will be able to:

- Introduce the concept of rhythm through various musical styles.
- Develop students' ability to recognize, reproduce, and create basic rhythmic patterns.
- Include flamenco as a Spanish cultural example.
- Encourage exploration and participation in creating rhythms.
- Facilitate a discussion about different musical styles and rhythm

# **Equipment and material**

- Percussion Instruments:
  - **Tambourines**: Traditional percussion instruments with vibrant and cheerful sounds. If we do not have the material, we can use classroom material, metal objects...



• **Small drums**: Ideal for creating basic rhythms and fostering coordination. If we do not have the material, we can use sticks and hit the classroom table.



 Castanets: Characteristic of flamenco, producing rhythmic sounds. If we do not have the material or do not have the budget, we can omit this instrument: <a href="https://amzn.eu/d/aUhe6d2">https://amzn.eu/d/aUhe6d2</a>



 Claves: Ideal for precise and clear rhythmic patterns. If we do nothave the material, we can use wooden sticks.







 Cajón Flamenco: Percussion instrument with a wide range of sounds. If we do not have the material we can use a wooden box



Percussion sticks: Perfect for creating subtle and varied rhythms. If we do not have the
material or budget, we can use two wooden sticks: Palos de percusión de mazos de
madera para carillón de energía, xilófono, bloque de madera, Glockenspiel y 2 pares |

# **Learning outcomes (4 Cs)**

#### Content

- Concept of Rhythm:
  - Definition of rhythm in music and its significance.
  - Identification of rhythm in different music styles, including flamenco.
- Percussion Instruments:
  - Introduction to various percussion instruments such as tambourine, drum, castanets, claves, cajón flamenco, and their role in creating rhythms.
  - Rhythmic Patterns: Recognition and reproduction of basic rhythmic patterns.
  - Creation of simple rhythmic patterns using percussion instruments.
- Flamenco Culture:
  - Exploration of Spanish culture and the art of flamenco.
  - Understanding the relationship between flamenco, music, and dance.
- Motor Coordination:
  - Development of fine motor skills through handling percussion instruments.
  - Improvement of hand-eye coordination and synchronization when reproducing rhythmic patterns.
- Musical Expression and Communication:
  - Sharing ideas and rhythmic patterns in groups, fostering communication and collaboration.
  - Expressing musical preferences and opinions about the experienced styles.

  - Enhancing fine motor skills by manipulating percussion instruments.
  - Improving coordination and synchronization while reproducing rhythmic patterns.
- Memory Enhancement:
  - Strengthening memory recall by learning and reproducing rhythmic patterns.
  - Developing memory retention by actively engaging in rhythm- based activities.
- Conceptual Understanding:
  - Grasping the concept of rhythm and its manifestation across different musical genres, including flamenco.
  - Identifying and reproducing basic rhythmic patterns to comprehend the fundamental elements of rhythm.
- Critical Thinking Skills:
  - Analyzing and imitating differentrhythmical structures and patterns presented in diverse musical compositions.
  - Evaluating the variation in rhythm within different musical styles encountered during the activities.
- Attention and Concentration Improvement:
  - Increasing attention span and concentration by engaging in rhythmic activities that demandfocus and precision.

- Exploration of Spanish Culture:
  - Understanding elements of Spanish culture through the exploration of flamenco music and dance.
  - Learning about the historicaland cultural significance of flamenco within the Spanish heritage.
- Appreciation of Flamenco as Art:
  - Appreciating flamenco as an art form encompassing music, dance, and cultural expression.
  - Understanding the emotional and cultural context embeddedin flamenco performances.
- Cultural Diversity and Exposure:
  - Exposing students to diverse musical styles, including flamenco, to promote appreciation for cultural variety.
  - Encouraging an understanding of the richness and diversity within global music traditions
- Cultural Connection through Music:
  - Creating a connection between cultural heritage and musical expression, specifically through flamenco.
  - Emphasizing the role of music in preserving and expressing cultural identities.
- Cultural Context in Rhythmic Exploration:
  - Providing context for rhythmic exploration by integrating cultural significance and historical context.
  - Encouraging students to recognize the cultural roots and influences behind various rhythms and musical styles

### Communication

Language Function:

- Vocabulary Enrichment: Learning and using specific music-related words and terms

### Vocabulary:

Words pertaining to rhythm, instruments, and musical genres encountered during the activities

#### Verbs:

- Action Verbs: Used to describe playing instruments and creating rhythms
- Communication Verbs: Engaging in dialogue, explaining techniques, and discussing preferences





### Language structure:

- Simple Sentences: Forming descriptive sentences to convey musical actions and experiences.
- Question & Answer Format: Asking and responding to inquiries about musical techniques and preferences.

### **Activities**

### Step 1: Introduction to Rhythm and Musical Examples

- Explanation of Rhythm:
  - Briefly define rhythm in music as the organization of sounds in time. Discussion about the significance of rhythm across various musical styles.
- Playing Diverse Music:
  - Present musical examples from different genres, including flamencoand other styles with distinct rhythms.
  - Allow students to listen and become familiar with differentrhythmic variations.

### Step 2: Exploration of Rhythm with Instruments and Flamenco Examples

- Instrument Distribution:
  - Equitably distribute percussion instruments among students.
- Playing Flamenco Music:
  - Play flamenco music and other styles with distinctive rhythms. Instruct students to replicate heard rhythms using the providedinstruments.

### Step 3: Rhythm Games and Activities with Flamenco Influences

- Use of Rhythmic Pattern Cards:
  - Distribute cards displaying varied rhythmic patterns inspired byflamenco.
  - Divide students into groups to reproduce patterns using claps, feet, or instruments.
- Group-based Rhythm Creation:
  - In small groups, encourage students to develop their own rhythmicpatterns.
  - Share and replicate each group's pattern within the larger groupsetting.

### Step 4: Creation of Varied Rhythmic Patterns

- Group-based Composition:
  - Guide students to combine elements from different musical styles, including flamenco, in creating new rhythmic patterns.
  - Facilitate discussions and encourage creativity in patterncreation.
- Presentation and Reflection:
  - Allow groups to present their rhythmic compositions to the entireclass.
  - Facilitate a discussion about the blends of styles and the rhythmicpatterns created.





The teacher's role involves facilitating, guiding, and providing support throughout the activities, ensuring students' understanding frhythm and fostering their creativity in exploring and creating rhythmic patterns.

### **Evaluation**

The assessment method could combine several approaches, including direct observation, reviewing the final presentation, self- assessment, and peer assessment. This would allow for a comprehensive evaluation, considering individual performance and teamwork, as well as conceptual understanding and musical creativity among the students.

#### **Assessment Methods**

#### - Direct Observation:

- Observing students' performance during the activities.
- Assessing their participation, collaboration skills, and ability tofollow rhythmic patterns.

#### Formative Assessment:

- Providing feedback during the activities to correct errors and enhance skills in real-time.
- Offering comments on accuracy in reproducing patterns and creativity in rhythm creation.

### - Presentation and Demonstration:

 Evaluating final group presentations and their compositions. Observing the quality of execution, originality, and understanding of the taught concepts.

### Self-Assessment and Peer Assessment:

- Allowing students to assess their own patterns and those of theirpeers.
- Encouraging reflection on the learning process and groupcollaboration.

# **Evaluation Criteria**

#### - Rhythmic Accuracy:

- Assessing accuracy in reproducing taught rhythmic patterns and those created by the students.
- Musical Creativity: Evaluating originality and creativity in developing new rhythmicpatterns.

## - Participation and Collaboration:

Assessing active participation in group activities and collaboration with peers.

#### Conceptual Understanding:

Verifying understanding of the concept of rhythm and application of the learned elements.

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
